SuS_AGRI aims to capitalise the methodology developed by the REBOUND project "Fostering Resilience in Rural Communities" funded by the ERASMUS+ Priority Theme programme transferring it in the territories of South Adriatic. REBOUND project was identified as flagship project in the frame of actions for resilient rural areas by the European Rural Vision. The South Adriatic area is characterized by favourable natural conditions for the development of agriculture productions. However, in the last years this area is also exposed to drought, floods, frost, strong winds and rising salinity level of agricultural lands. Due to climate change effects, water scarcity, change in precipitation regime, bacteria and rising temperature have been identified as major climate risk factors across the agriculture sector of the South Adriatic area. SuS_AGRI aims to identify a mitigation actions to the main regional risks, evaluating their impacts on programme area. In detail, SuS_AGRI aims to strengthen the base knowledge of farm producers in the South Adriatic area on agricultural practices to mitigate the effects of global warming. PPs will organize a workshop to analyze the needs of rural communities across programme area to determine what is required to improve their resilience. On the basis of this preliminary analysis, project partners will implement a training course of 30 hours to be held in each country, involving 20 farm producers with particular importance to young people and women. The developed training will be insert in a joint action plan for improving rural resilience that will be adopted by partners and the main stakeholders, through the signature of a Memorandum of Understanding. A final conference will be organize to engage with multiple actors in transferring project learnings and the action plan into practice and to improve awareness about climate change effects on agricultural sector, promoting innovative nature-based solutions for resilient agriculture.

Which of the organisation's thematic competences and experiences are relevant for the project?

PdC is a management body of protected area aimed to promote a sustainable development model, while helping to enhance the quality of life of the whole community. PdC occupies approximately 1.100 acres of the territories of Ostuni and Fasano, 8 km of coast, while the remaining part stretches inland towards the agricultural areas. PdC has a long experience in management of EU Founded projects and have a good financial capacity results adequate to cover the cash flow necessary for the implementation of activities. In the territories of the Park there is the highest concentration in the world of millenary olive trees, about 212,000 registered plants of extraordinary botanical value protected by the Regional Law 14/2007, which declared their monumentality, recognising them as a "cultural asset". In 2017 the Ministry of Agricultural Policies registered the "Agricultural Landscape of the Plain of the Monumental Olive Groves of Puglia" in the National Register of Historical Rural Landscapes.

Which of the organisation's thematic competences and experiences are relevant for the project?

Municipality of Roskovec (MoR), with a total population of around 21.000 inhabitants, is a municipality of the Fier County. Furthermore, the pilot reference sites selected by the partners represent areas where agricultural production is a driving force of the local economy and are strongly exposed to the effects of climate change. PDC, thanks to the study phase for the candidacy of the Piana degli Olivi Monumentali in the Register of Italian Rural Historical Landscapes, and to the cooperation with research institutes to support farmers in the contrast of the bacterium Xylella Fastidiosa, has the necessary knowledge for the implementation of the project activities that it will be focused on the recent scientific results to contrast the bacterium Xylella Fastidiosa and its impacts. MoR has a strong expertise in the management of climate change impacts on agriculture and on the enhancement of agricultural products, in fact the agriculture occupies the main place of income where 70% of the area is field, production of agricultural products and 30% soft hills, cultivation of the olive plant. The total number of farmers who cultivate olives are 973 and the total area planted with olive trees is 9674.01ha. During one year, 4.189.120 kg of oil is produced. Agriculture is one of the strategic branches of development of the MoD and Bjelopavlići plain is a well-known agricultural area of Danilovgrad, considering the mild climate and the possibility of irrigation from the Zeta and Sušica rivers. Moreover, MoD have a great experience in the support measures of the agriculture producers, e.g. providing solar panels for livestock breeders.

Finally, Legamabiente Molise APS has been committed for years to raising awareness of the importance of water resources in Molise region, and to supporting farm producers to contrast the impacts of climate change, especially related to safety and sustainability.
